4. Background of the Organisation:

The founders realised that there were many children running around in their community who had no hope of education and a seemingly blurry future. They were moved to support these children's education and possibly, their upkeep. This is how Little Flower School was conceived. The school started with eight (8) children in the founders' residence and prepared under-privileged children in a pre-school session (which they otherwise could not afford). The children were later enrolled in the government schools after they had been qualified. The school has currently grown to a big school, including Kindergarten and Primary School level. The organisation was established in 2008 under Kerygma teams; a missionary organisation but now registered on its own with registration number CG 164782105 at the Registrar General's Department and social welfare (registration number: D.S.D. 6496).
